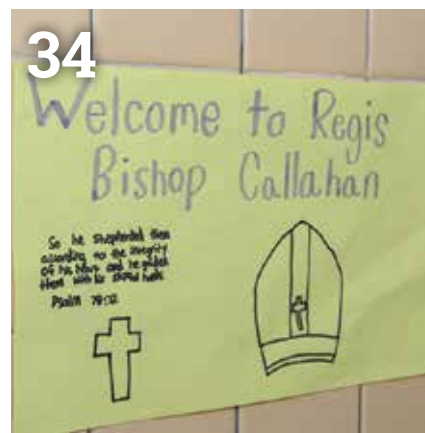

Report

From the Dean

I remember the day well - October 7, 2022. While getting ready for morning Mass, I received a phone call from the DeRosier family. It was to inform me that one of the most dedicated Catholics and Regis supporters I know, Duane Hull, had died on vacation in Hawaii. The emotions ran deep since I consider Duane a dear friend and I had the honor of teaching his son, Max, when I was Chaplain at Regis from 2005-2012. It was one of those days you never want to have, but a day you will never forget.

When the day of the funeral came, things were predictably crazy at St. Olaf. I was so happy for Duane and his wife Bernie that it felt like half of the city of Eau Claire came for the visitation and funeral. It was one of those tear-stained moments of grief and gratitude.

Then, a simple request came from Max, “Fr. James, are the doors to the school locked?”

“Yes, Max, they are.”

“Could you unlock them... I want to see my school.”

I got a lump in my throat at the request. I immediately thought back to my Chaplain days and the many alumni from St. Olaf grade school that were pillars of my Campus Ministry work: In addition to Max Hull, Anna and Mary Ellen Ostrowski, Amy, Joe, and Alissa Zawacki, Becca Liming, and many more. I had a chat the other day with Bill Zawacki, father of the Zawacki kids mentioned, and he was giving me an update on his son, Joe. He is now a science teacher at Pacelli High School in Stevens Point and is starting some co-curricular activities that remind me of a lot of things we did when both Joe and I were at Regis. Amazing how a simple request can evoke such strong memories. And what a beautiful legacy to St. Olaf grade school to have been a part of Joe's formation.

Take this month to give thanks for the places and people that have helped shape you.

And may we also pray and work to never have another school in our city have to ask their pastor to unlock the doors of their school. May we keep these doors wide open so we can have more Max Hulls, Joe Zawackis, Anna Ostrowskis, Taryn Alexanders, John Snyders, Andy Nieses, Paul Pedersens, and many others who are products of Catholic schools.

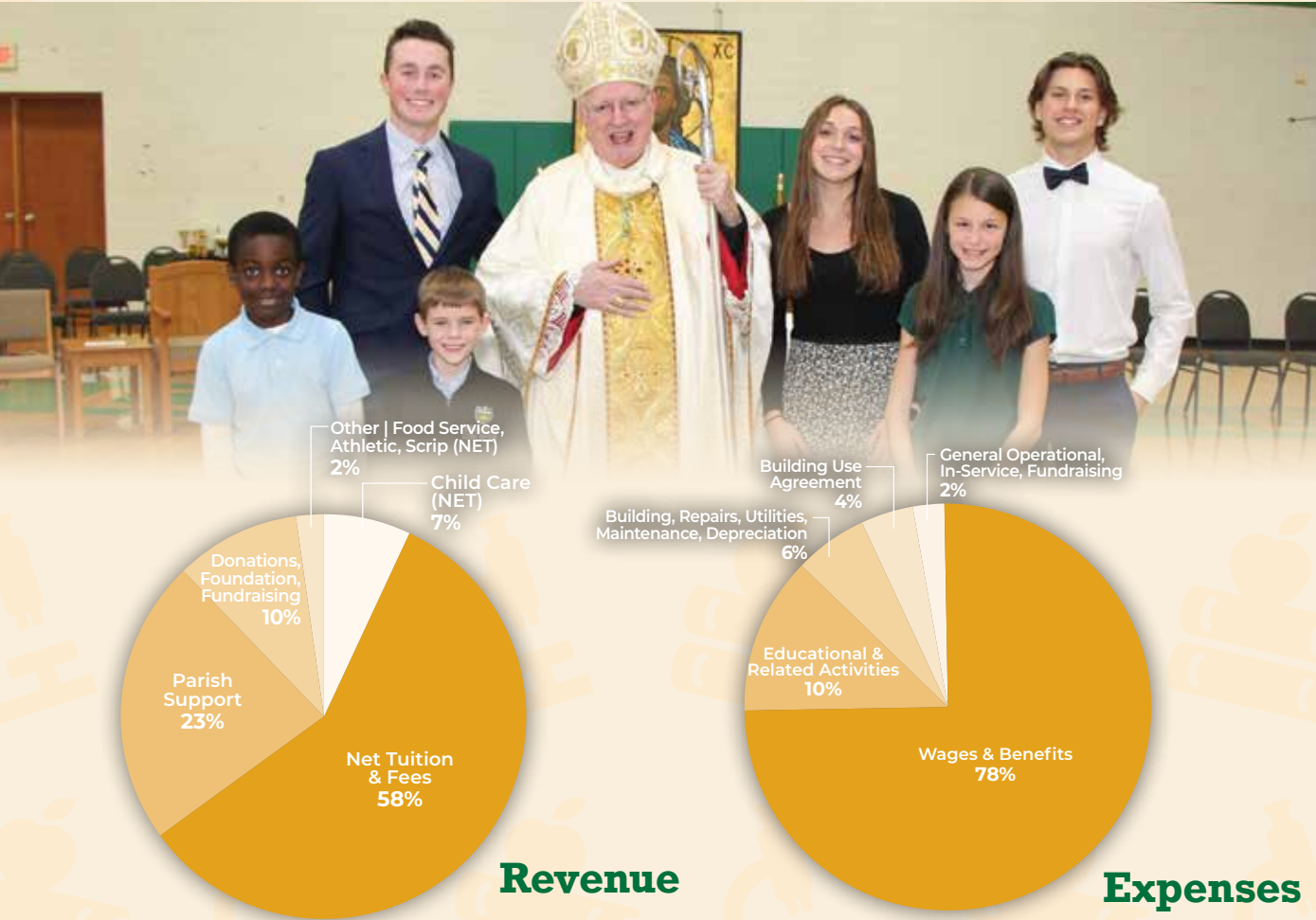

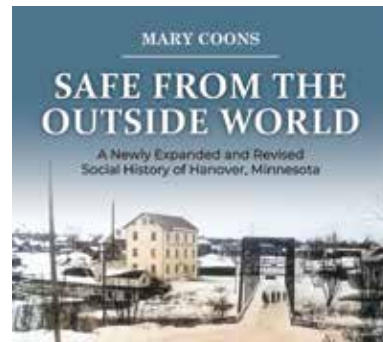
Members of the Regis ProLife Club participated in the annual Life Chain on the school's campus in October.

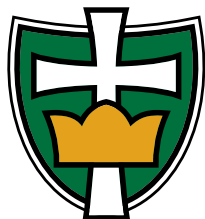
